Company-owned lumber stands ensure against shortages in supply. Operating a sawmill, cutting and molding plants near the source of raw material, production units and transportation units. Products from these operations is transformed by a patented process into beautiful, long-lasting, mold-resistant and composite garage doors.

Environmental Responsibility



Since JELD-WEN's inception in 1988, the wise and efficient use of natural resources has been the heart of the responsible ways in which we make high performance windows and doors. JELD-WEN uses recycled and sustainable materials whenever possible. Early on, JELD-WEN developed a proprietary process that recycles wood chips by-products into mulch used for landscaping. The process is still used to make mulch for trees and composite garage doors. Today JELD-WEN windows and exterior doors are ENERGY STAR® certified and can help save energy inside and outside your home.

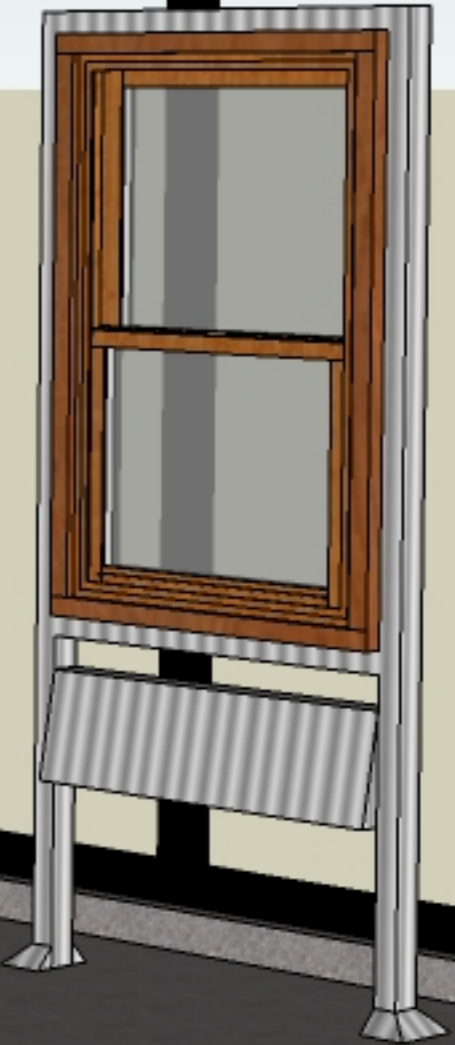
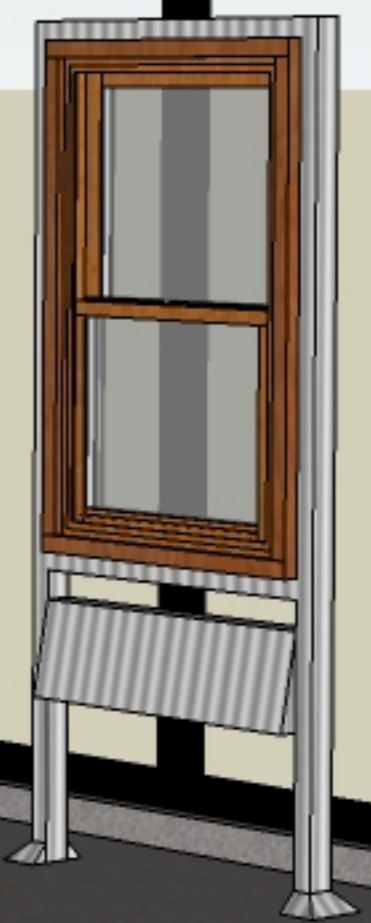
