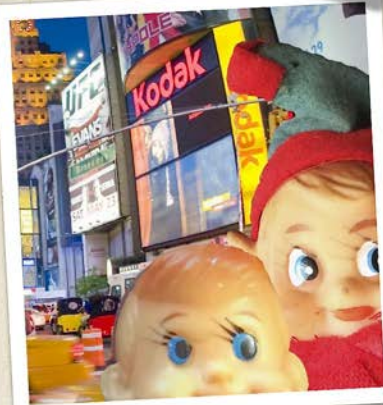
No More Shelf - A trip around the world

Buenos Aires was fun. Did some skating and visited the Cathedral de La Plata. Then off to Río. Saw the artistic side the Festival! WOW!





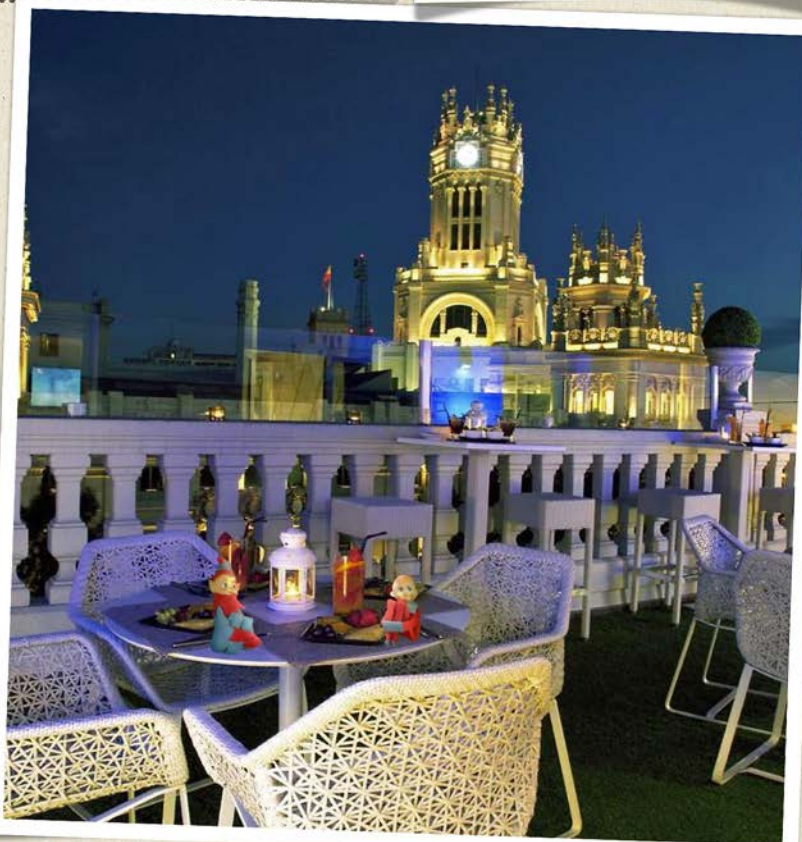
Cape Town, Botswana (The Kalahari Desert), Madagascar & Tanzania

Historic Ashford Castle and the oldest pub in Ireland, The Brazen Head. The Palace Guard inspection was a lot of fun also.







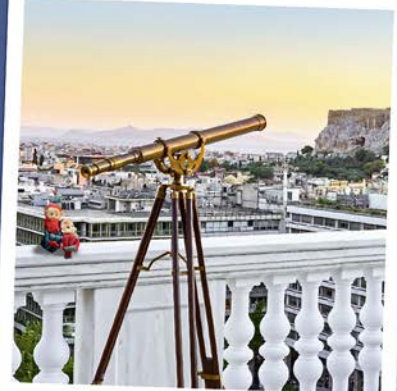
Copenhagen, Denmark Germany & Vienna, Austria

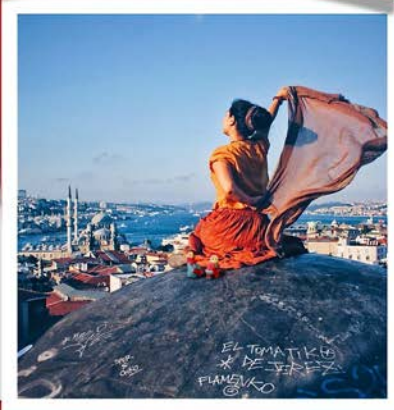
Cairo, Egypt

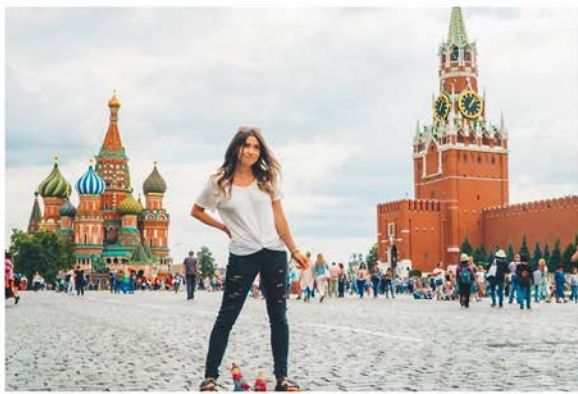

Mecca, one more important historical site to add to our list. Sidewall surfing with the Sheik. Admiring Istanbul from a unique location and partaking in the famous mud baths.

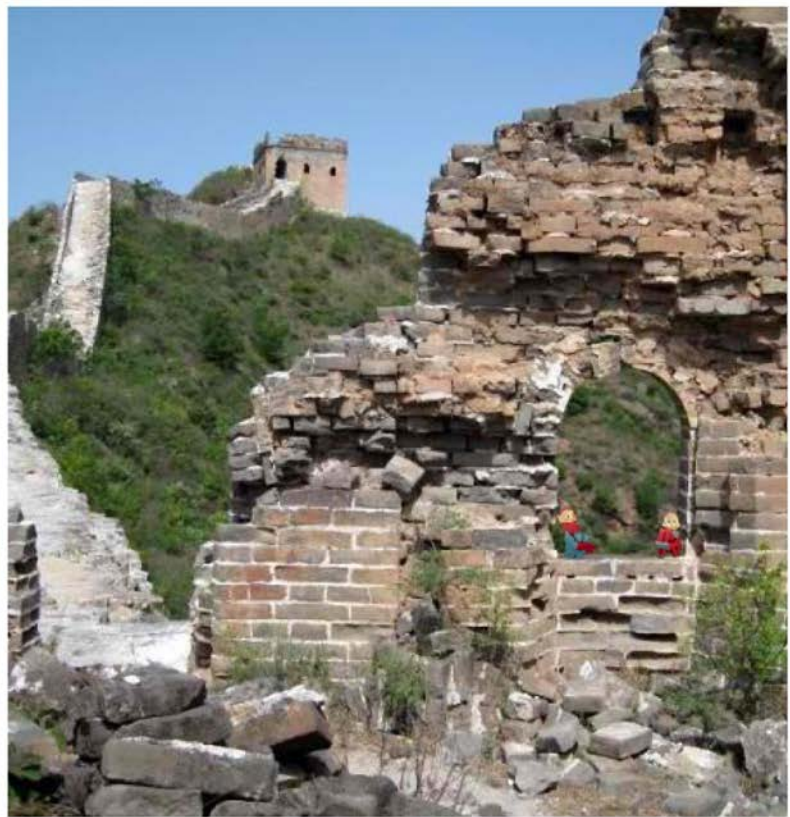




Moscow, Russia - Mumbai, India Nepal & Tibet

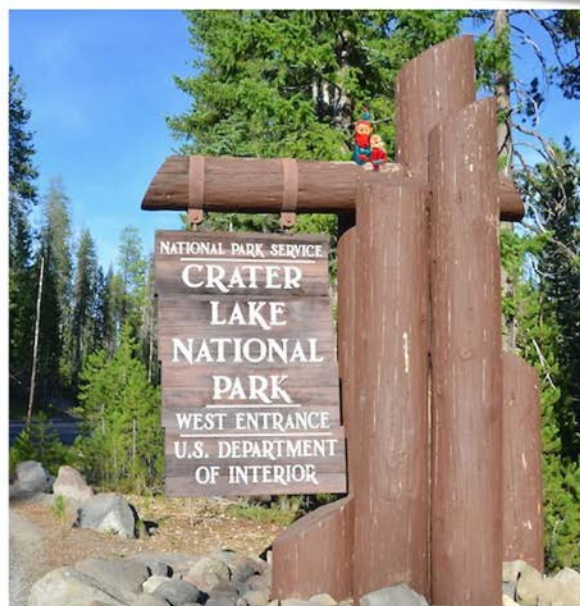


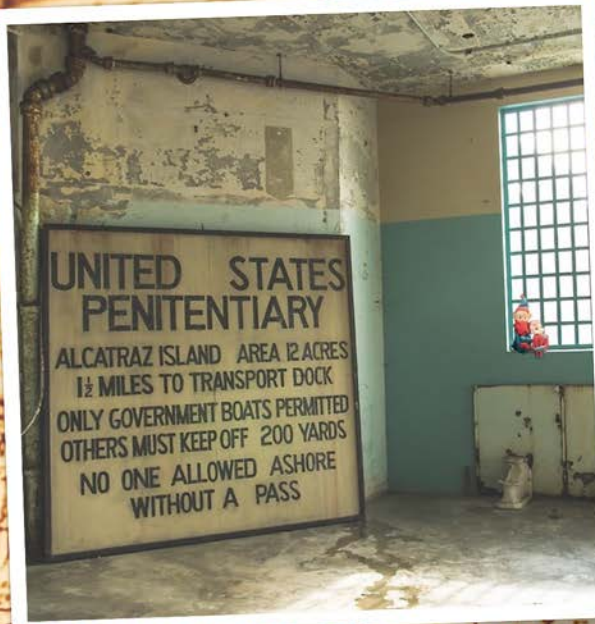




Vancouver, Canada & Seattle, Washington

Utah Salt Flats, South Dakota, St. Louis & New Orleans

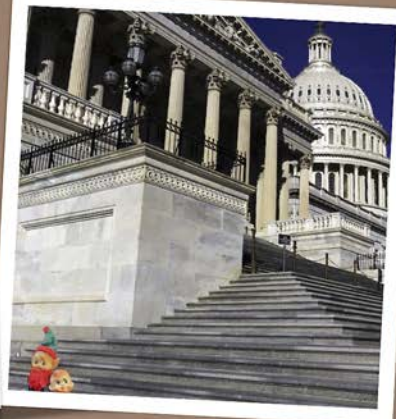
